Washington State Labor Council, AFL-CIO Endorsements:

NO ON I-920. It would cut taxes for the multi-millionaires—but not for you. And your children would pay the price. Bankrolled by a few of the state's richest families, I-920 would repeal their estate taxes by cutting \$100 million a year from the Education Legacy Trust, which pays for K-12 school improvements, smaller class sizes and college enrollment slots.

NO ON I-933. It would force taxpayers to pay developers to obey the law. I-933 creates a "pay or waive" system where taxpayers pay millions of dollars for irresponsible land development, or must exempt owners and corporations



from land-use laws. It will cost millions of dollars just to administer I-933.

YES ON I-937. It promotes the use of clean, renewable energy resources. I-937, the Clean Energy Initiative, guarantees that 15% of the electricity from Washington's largest utilities comes from plentiful, home-grown renewable energy sources, such as wind and solar, by 2020. I-937 will create new family-wage engineering, construction and design jobs, and provide crucial income to rural landowners.

Local 8 Mourns the Loss of Two Exceptional Shop Stewards

JoAnn Kaye, Shop Steward at Olympic Community Action, died on September 6. JoAnn first became a Local 8 member in 1994, when she was instrumental in organizing a union for the first time at her workplace. She remained an active member of Local 8 over the years as a Shop Steward, Bargaining Team member and a frequent visitor to Olympia to raise awareness about home care workers and the need to improve their working conditions. Her activism extended throughout the state.

When workers in Longview picketed during a first contract struggle, JoAnn rode her Harley all the way from Port Angeles to show support. Just last summer, she shared her experiences as a union member to help workers in eastern Washington organize a union for the first time.

JoAnn and her husband Dan were both very active in Combat Veterans International and devoted motorcycle riders. JoAnn will be missed by many of us at Local 8 who appreciated her commitment to her fellow union members and her willingness to fight for justice in the workplace. Donations can be made to: Olympic

Andy Turkovich, Shop Steward at Sea Mar Bellingham, died on August 12 at the age of 62. He was born in Jamestown, New York, served in Vietnam (first as a combat engineer and then as a registered nurse), got married in Honolulu in 1969, raised a family, and retired from the Army in 1993.

In 1999 he moved to Washington where he continued his nursing career and, in 2001, became a member of Local 8. He served as a Shop Steward and on the Bargaining Team—his fellow team members remember his incredible dedication to being a part of negotiations: he came to meetings even after working the night shift.

GENTLE WARRIOR AWARD Congratulations to Local 8 President Verlene Jones for receiving the prestigious A. Philip Randolph Pullman Porter Museum "Gentle Warrior" Award. Verlene won the award in honor of her commitment to the labor movement and excellence in labor education. The "Gentle Warrior" awards are given each year to deserving African-Americans who exemplify the quiet gentle warrior spirit for which A. Philip Randolph was known throughout his career. He organized the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters in 1925 and then in 1955 was elected the first African-American Vice President of the AFL-CIO.

First Local 8 Union Plus Scholarship Winner!

Washington, DC—Sarah E. Strole, daughter of Local 8 member Barbara Strole of Spokane, was selected to receive a \$2,000 Union Plus Scholarship award for 2006. She is one of 108 students from 44 unions who have won.

She also received a \$36,000 a year academic scholarship to Georgetown University—one of the top 25 colleges in America.

Raised by a single mom, she's indeed involved in a wide range of community service organizations—from a women's shelter and a food bank to tutoring Head Start kids and participating in a Medical Partnership Mission trip to Romania, while also working 20 hours per week at a fast-food restaurant.

While her specific career goal is not yet shaped, her life mission is.

"My passion is for the poor who are most exploited in the world, especially children," she says, and continues, "I want to dedicate my life to helping the poor and people living in injustice."
