## **Teleworking Discussions**

NJP Management has indicated an interest in discussing staff flexibility for working in a remote/hybrid setting once offices reopen with an eye toward:

- How has remote work been going?
- What may be possible/realistic once offices are open to the public?
- What values and guidance will be important in a new telecommuting policy?

NJP has asked us to help identify and form two small groups (of 5-8 employees each) of union represented **legal assistants** and **advocates** from the field offices. The commitment would be to attend 1-2 "listening sessions" with Hickory Gateless (Deputy Director), Sue Encherman (Director of Administration), and Dave Forrester (Director of IT) that would last approximately 1.5-2 hours each.

The hope is to get a diverse (re: tenure at NJP, size of office, geographic location, and overall background/perspective) group of volunteers to participate.
