Compensation Issues: Fighting for What's Right!

Review Your Pay Stub! Were You Paid Correctly for Working Over 40 Hours During a Holiday Week?

The Union believes Crisis Connections recently changed its interpretation and application of overtime pay during holiday weeks. It appears Crisis Connections did not include hours worked on President's Day when calculating overtime for the week of 02/20/22 - 02/26/22. As a result, we are aware of at least three Crisis Department employees who did not receive the proper overtime pay on their 3/15 paycheck (which included hours worked during the week of President's Day).

All hours worked in excess of 40 within the 7-day workweek should count toward overtime. We have reached out to Crisis Connections to have this rectified ASAP.

There are labor laws that set parameters around hours and compensation as they relate to overtime and Crisis Connections cannot provide something less than is guaranteed by law. The Union reviewed both the past practice and internal policies regarding Holiday Pay and Overtime/Premium Pay and we simply don't see how Crisis Connections can justify denying the overtime. Holiday pay and overtime are clearly two separate and distinct things. Receiving one should not prohibit an employee from receiving the other.
