Washington State Labor Council President Rick Bender predicted that if George Bush wins the November election, union membership will fall by 50% in the next generation. in your life." The goal for Washington state this year is to turn out 10,000 volunteers to distribute fliers and talk to union brothers and sisters. The WSLC is challenging all of its

affiliate union locals to turn out 3% of their members to volunteer for Labor Neighbor 2004. For Local 8, that's 120 volunteers!

Labor Neighbor volunteers will be asked to spend at least one 4 hour shift walking neighborhoods to distribute literature to fellow union members about Labor's endorsed candidates, including President, Governor and state legislative priorities. It's a fun, positive way to put the grassroots back into politics.



King County Housing Authority Workers Fight for their First Contract

Workers at the King County Housing Authority voted to have a union last April to win standards that other union housing authority workers enjoy, for example a fair wage scale that recognizes years of service.



But it's been almost a year in negotiations and we're having trouble convincing KCHA management to step up to the plate. So workers are taking their concerns to the community.

Be a Delegate to the Washington State Labor Council Convention!

Every two years, Local 8 elects new delegates to the Washington State Labor Council convention. The WSLC is considered to be the "voice" of labor in our state. This year Local 8 has 10 delegate positions open.

The Convention is an exciting event where decisions are made about labor movement policy and direction as well as important political endorsement decisions. It's also a great way to socialize and meet other union activists.

The convention this year is being held in Tacoma from Monday, August 23 to Thursday, August 26.

Local 8 will pay for the registration, transportation and a per diem but can't reimburse for any time loss. Members will need to use personal leave time.

Come to the next Local 8 membership meeting on Wednesday, June 23 for the nominations and election of the delegate positions. If you'd like to be nominated but can't attend the meeting, you can have someone nominate you, but you'll need to submit a letter to the Local 8 office saying you accept the nomination.
