Bargaining Update and Petition

Our bargaining team met with management on Friday March 10. Management responded to our wage proposal with the same 4% wage increase we've received the past three years.

We discussed safety issues at clinics across Sea Mar, ranging from Vancouver to Aberdeen. Our bargaining team addressed the lack of safe parking, poor lighting, and the need to provide safer environments for patients and staff. You have the legal right to support your union and to participate in union activities!

Your employer cannot legally punish or discriminate against any worker because of union activity.

Our team reviewed our proposals and looked for places we can compromise and where we need to continue to hold. We continue to push for multi-lingual pay in recognition of the vital work these staff provide to Sea Mar participants and patients. We continue to hold on a significant wage increase. The status quo is not enough.

We are awaiting management's response on increasing PTO, defining timeframes for transfers, premiums for workload when covering vacancies, and addressing the ongoing inequities of wage compression and market adjustments. We return to the bargaining table Friday, March 17th.
